EDITORIAL

One often wonders what motivates volunteers to come to Holy Family Hospital despite being unjustifiably cautioned by western media against coming to this part of the world.

Is it only their love for adventure that makes these volunteers travel thousands of kilometers far away from their homes, families and work places? Is it dissatisfaction with their stressful work which leads them to accept unpaid jobs? Or is it because their work has become routine and they have lost their motivation? For those who believe in God, is it an inspiration to spend a part of their life in the Holy Land? Is it because of disillusionment with their emotional life? Or is it something else?

Although motivation may be different for each individual volunteer, a volunteer's moral strength and desire to help his fellow human beings, to practice international solidarity and to discover a new culture are essential to keep him going. Holding on to our motivation as volunteers is not always easy, especially when we are under stress or when our work becomes a deadly routine. Our success depends solely on having the right motivation, which for us as Christians is our deep faith in God and our true belief that we have been called upon by God to undertake what we are doing. "Tuitio fidei and obsequium pauperum" as Brother Gerard did a century ago in Saint John's Hospital in Jerusalem.

"Personally I left my family motivated

by going and meeting others, meeting myself and especially here in the Holy Land, Jesus Christ. I am sure, this will grant me a deeper dimension for my job and future life," told me one volunteer.

"If you cross waters I will be with you and the rivers they will not submerge you. If you go through the fire, you will not suffer and the flame will not burn you" (Isaiah 43.2)

Leaning on this assertion which was transmitted by the prophet Isaiah, most volunteers believe that their "mission" has a deep human and spiritual component and that they are taking into consideration life with all its aspects, success and failure, joy and sadness, richness and poverty. This is especially indispensable in this wounded country of Palestine.

Our team at HFH is very grateful to the five French volunteers (one doctor, two midwives and two nurses), who are staying at HFH between 6 months and 2 years. We are grateful for their readiness to integrate with the local team and for their willingness to respect the Palestinian culture and for exchanging their work and life experiences. It is a mutual enrichment and a door which opens the world to those Palestinians who aren't allowed to leave their country.


