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Editorial



During this summer, the people of the Holy Land suffered a lot of the conflict in and around Gaza. On July 8, 2014 the Israeli Defense Force launched an operation on Gaza strip. The stated aim of the Israeli operation was to stop rocket fire from Gaza into Israel and in July 17, the operation was expanded to ground mission. It was a very difficult time for all the people on both sides of the Gaza border. Both sides agree for ceasefire several times but a ceasefire agreement was reached on August 26, 2014. The hope is that fighting will end permanently from both sides and that people will start to recover.

On the humanitarian side, there is big number of people in need of medical interventions, health services, shelter, clean water, food and psychosocial support (especially for children). A lot of families need to be helped; they have lost three or more of their members. The war left a lot of injured people and estimates indicate that more than 1000 children injured will have a permanent disability. Many Schools, clinics and hospitals were damaged and closed and explosive remnants of war are left in civilian areas affected by conflict, causing a major threat to children. Moreover, Inadequate hygiene (partly because of large amounts of refuse not collected), lack of water, and food shortages is directly affecting citizens mainly children. As a result, children suffer chest infections, diarrhea, rashes and scabies. In addition to physical damage, so many children require direct and specialized psychosocial support on the basis of families who have experienced death, injury or loss of home.

So Many international institute, churches and NGOs mobilize a supporting program to help the suffering people of Gaza. And the Holy Family Hospital, with the approval from the Order of Malta acted immediately and watched the critical situation, and after reviewing all the needs for the people, decided to

Finally, we hope that this ceasefire lead to resumption of serious peace negotiations to resolve the core issue of this never ending cycle of violence and the end of conflict. Let us all keep praying for lasting

peace in the Middle East.
