From fear of the unknown to the feeling of safety and security. This is what faten experienced during her journey from Gaza to Bethlehem, according to her words.

A Palestinian woman with a bachelor degree in social science, pregnant with twins 33 weeks, living in Gaza with her family that consists of her husband and her two children aged 7 and 3 years old. Despite

all the difficulties she's living in; she decided to work with the Palestinian relief foundation as a social consultant where she finds her stability and her happiness as she explained.

In January 7<sup>th</sup>, 2019 her life changed as she said, when she decided to visit Bethlehem to attend a training course for five days through the PCRF. After few hours from arriving Bethlehem Faten was faced with a serious medical condition, she started bleeding and having contraction so one of her colleagues advised her to checkup at Holy Family Hospital to get the best medical care she might need.

she was admitted under observation to the hospital on January 6<sup>th</sup>,2019 and during the second day she gave birth to her twins' premature babies (33wks of pregnancy), Muhamad and Abed through a cesarean section. The babies health status was not good so they required intensive care in the neonate department, which caused a lot of stress to her and the rest of her family especially that her family and her husband are far from her and cannot visit due to the political issues.

Faten was worried about her babies when they were admitted to the NICU at holy family hospital because she's in a place where she doesn't know the efficiency of the service, so she asked the doctors to transfer her babies to a hospital close to her home. But because the residential area of the family is in Gaza and the transfer is not easy to do that might endanger the life of her premature therefore the doctor's decision was to keep the babies in the NICU at HFH. Faten agreed with the doctors' decision but remained concerned about her Babies.



However, the economic situation of the family did not

allow them to afford the expenses of the operation and the babies treatment. So faten suffered emotionally and economically leading her to seek financial assistance from the hospital.

The Holy Family Hospital did not hesitate to take the opportunity to embrace Faten and her babies and provide them with medical, psychological and financial support to overcome this crisis.

It's worth mentioning that the second baby of Faten -abed Rahman- has finished his treatment in 22 january,2019 so Faten had to take her baby out of the hospital. But Holy Family Hospital did not leave her halfway, the hospital allowed her to stay at the postnatal department with her baby to wait until the second baby is discharged from NICU.



Faten said: "I was afraid of everything, and I was very worried about my newborn babies while my family is far from me, but Holy Family Hospital was able to provide me and my babies with the best medical care and psychological support that led me now to feel as if my family were with me. You are my family now and I will never forget you. It was God's will to put me in your hands so that my babies would have the best medical care, they will get the best quality of life thanks to your efforts. I will never forget that you gave me a safe place in the hospital to wait for my babies discharged from the NICU. I'm very thankful to the Holy Family Hospital for everything and will always remain in my memory and my heart.

On January 27, 2019 Muhamad the second baby of Faten has finished his treatment, so Faten took her babies Muhamad and Abed Rahman home with joy filling her heart.
