During 2017, an increased number of consultations and deliveries have been noted in the Holy Family Hospital, it is probably related to the good reputation and high standard care in our hospital, many of the mothers come to the hospital from the south of west bank just because they know that they will have a safe birth of a healthy newborn, it is really a chain of awareness and success for the whole team of HFH. Despite the increased number of deliveries and the clear overload of work in various departments of HFH, we continue to have an impressive success stories that need to be taken into consideration and an extra credit for the team of HFH.

One of our success stories had occurred on june,15, 2017, where Mrs. S.A. a lady with first term pregnancy, uneventful antenatal care outside HFH, at her 40 weeks of gestation, admitted to our hospital on June15th,2017 at 02:00 am with mild regular contractions for delivery, the routine examinations had been performed, and patient was kept in the antenatal ward to reassess when pain increase. At 07:50 am the lady informed the midwife in the antenatal ward that she has just started to have passage of small clots after the water has been broken (SROM), with severe contractions, the midwife examined the patient directly and transferred her urgently to the labor ward, where at 07:55am, the fetal monitoring was directly applied and showed that there is severe reduction of the fetal heart beat (Severe Bradycardia), the resident doctor in

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the labour room directly called the consultant, the anesthetist and neonatologist at 07:57 to perform an urgent Cesarean section to save the life of the newborn due to suspected placental separation (abruptio placenta) the lady was prepared rapidly and transferred to the operation theatre in the labour ward, where all the staff has been available including the anesthesia, obstetricians and the neonatologists.

Under general anesthesia a super urgent C-section was performed and delivered a female newborn weight 3000 gm at 08:10, pale, flaccid and no heart rate at all, the neonatologists started the resuscitation procedure without any delay to save the life of the newborn, and only after 10 minutes of resuscitation the heart beat return back but with reduced beats (under 60/min) and the baby was already intubated and transferred to the NICU after the newborn has been stabilized.

During the C-section, the diagnosis has been made to be a vasa previa and the placenta was sent for histopathology for confirmation (Velamentous Insertion of the umbilical cord and vasa previa)

The vasa previa is a rare condition where foetal blood vessels are present in the membranes covering the internal cervical os, and when the water is broken a foetal bleeding occurs and the mortality rate is more than 98% when goes undiagnosed, the diagnosis of the Vasa Previa is made prenatally, and since the patient was not followed in HFH, no records have been made regarding the vasa previa.

The new-born was transfused during the first hour of life 2 units of blood because of severe blood loss, and was put in the cooling system for 72 hours to spare the brain from ischemia due to the reduced oxygen saturation due to foetal blood loss, and after 5 days the new born has been discharged home in good general condition without evident neurological consequences, but need to be followed by the neonatologist.

This success story is to be credited directly to the whole team of the HFH who are always ready to help and save lives at anytime.






