EDITORIAL

I am afraid that since a few months we have unfortunately been witness to a deterioration of the situation in this country.

On one hand, these last months several tragic events have brought a note of bloodshed to the Holy City of Jerusalem and on the other hand several articles published on internet or in the newspapers have made mention that all signs show that a bloody Hamas-Fatah confrontation will occur.

In the next weeks, and more than ever, we will pass through a period of turbulence with the elections in the States and perhaps in Israel and the renewal of the mandate of the President of the Palestinian Authority. The expectations of people in the Holy Land are enormous as far as their hope for a negotiated solution to their vital problems.

What can we do, except call the attention of the political local and international personalities to this problem and to pray for peace. Could God move away this most probably murderous confrontation which will lead Palestinians to civil war.

My stay in the Gaza Strip last month within the framework of an official mission of the Belgian Technical Cooperation showed to me the daily harsh realities of life in Gaza especially concerning liberty, food and health problems. I was commissioned to assess the quality of maternity and newborn care at Al Shifaa

hospital (more than 14.500 deliveries/year), as a step in developing interventions to improve childbirth care.

Understaffing of qualified nurses and doctors, impossibility to leave Gaza for training, lack of hygiene and equipment and regularly power cuts are the most important reasons for a very high mortality rate in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Helping in promote continuous medical education and staff upgrading by sending candidates outside of Gaza to Bethlehem University and to Holy Family Hospital will be our priority and contribution for the next years.

The lack of a purification station for waste water of a population of 1.8 million inhabitants turn the seaside into an open cesspool, where it is almost impossible to breathe. "It's true that it is difficult to imagine that anyone who is under siege, bombed, walled up in Palestine could appreciate the magnificence of the Song of Songs " (by the late Mahmud Darwish).

Unprejudiced, we are ready to bring our little contribution to the peace process in encouraging each initiative to bring people closer.
