The birth of a baby is a wonderful yet very complex process. Many physical and emotional changes occur for the mother and the baby.

A baby must make many physical adjustments to life outside the mother's body. Leaving the uterus means that a baby can no longer depend on the mother's circulation and placenta for important physiologic functions.

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Before birth, breathing, eating, elimination of waste, and immunologic protection all came from the mother. When a baby enters the world, many body systems change dramatically from the way they functioned during fetal life.

Your baby's body systems must work together in a new way. Sometimes, a baby has difficulty making the transition to the world. Being born prematurely, having a difficult delivery or birth defects can make these changes more challenging. Fortunately for these babies, special newborn care is available at HFH.

Thus, HFH Newborn babies who need intensive medical attention are often admitted into a special area of the hospital called the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).





October's Activity

Continuous Educational Courses at HFH

At early morning of the 17th, 18th and 24th, 25th October Holy Family Hospital held the ALSO like scientific day (Advanced life support in obstetrics), ALSO is an educational program designed to assist healthcare professionals in developing and maintaining the knowledge and procedural skills needed to manage emergencies that can arise in obstetrical care. The



ALSO training curriculum address issues such as: complications of pregnancy, labor and delivery, postpartum hemorrhage, safety in maternity care, and maternal resuscitation, which was considered to be essential since many of our new midwives and all the residents have not passed such a course before, we took the opportunity to perform such course by ourselves with the administration of the hospital by our local ALSO instructors who obtained the certification by Juzor organization who obtained the exclusive license from the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) to offer this course in the West Bzank and Gaza, making Palestine the second country in the Arab world to implement ALSO trainings. The addition of ALSO to reproductive health systems in Palestine has improved access to, standardization of and quality of emergency obstetric care (EOC); enhanced the teamwork approach to obstetric emergencies and the interactions between physicians and midwives; and facilitated dialogue among gynecologists and obstetricians and the pediatricians who participate in the Neonatal Resuscitation training associated with ALSO.





The Medical director of HFH Dr. Salsa' declared that the main intention of this course is to work hard to protect the mother and the child birth, as well to diminish the mortality rate in the Palestinian communities.

HFH stressed the need to hold such courses as well as indicating that the importance of science have a social dimension to connect doctors and nurses and all the staff working in the field of obstetrics and Gynecology among themselves, which helps to share knowledge and experiences.

We would like to express our gratitude and thankfulness to all who worked hard and dedicated all his/ her effort to make this course a successful one.
